Stop the Press: Long Standing Club Lap Record Broken

The Club Sports Series started in 2005 and the Club started keeping Lap Records for each circuit we have held club sanctioned events at. Over the years, these have included the Barbagallo Long and Short circuits, Collie Raceway, Jack's Hill Climb and even Bathurst. In the fifteen years the series has been running, one record had stood unbroken during all that time. It is the Open track record for the Barbagallo Long Circuit. On the 5th June 2006, Walter Epple stopped the clock in 60.9763 seconds in his 911 Race car. At the recent Sports Series round held on the 30th August, Barry Baltinas stopped the clock in a time of 60.5294 seconds in his GT3RS. Congratulations to Barry on one hot lap!

The Club had our own reserved section for members to gather, catch up and enjoy a nice hot cup of coffee or hot chocolate if preferred. Despite a couple of showers sweeping through, the morning was mostly dry and a great selection of classic cars turned up to delight all the car nuts that attended - no garage queens here. It was also great to see a couple of 928's in our display, breaking up the regular offerings of 911's, Caymans, Cayennes and Boxsters.



Classic Cars and Coffee always finishes around 10.30am, allowing everyone attending to enjoy the remainder of the day. Before long, a conga line of Porsches snaked out of the exit and headed off for a one hundred kilometre run through the hills to our latest lunch spot. As usual, the run sheets were well prepared and emailed out prior to the event to registered members. I believe that no-one lost their way on this run, which must be a first for the Club!

The final destination was Elmar's in the Valley. What a place - it is billed as Perth's biggest German establishment and includes the Biergarten & restaurant, a boutique brewery and also offers a fine selection of german smallgoods for sale. Heaven for those of us that love German food and beer. The staff were excellent and the food came out quickly. Many members tucked into the house speciality,

which is the "Elmar's Schweinshaxe" or pork shank. It was a chilly nine degrees that greeted members at Wanneroo Raceway for Round 5 of the Club's Sports Series. With members from the HSV Club and the Triumph Sports Owners Association also attending, there were fifty eight drivers lining up in pit lane. As usual, they were classified into Club groups based on their lap times and experience and then let loose on the track for five laps, before a cool down lap and parking back up in the pits.

It was great to see a number of rookies competing and the Ladies Plate was also back in play with Caroline Minton and Cheryl Leeds battling it out. Caroline won the day in her Boxster over Cheryl's Cayman.

For the Outright results, it was again Barry Baltinas in his GT3RS beating all comers with a lap time of 61.25 seconds, just pipping John Webb in his modified 911 Carrera by under half a second. Not much in it and some great driving by both. In third place for our Club results, and outright fourth on the day was Daniel Bathe in his Boxster S, in a time of 65.30 seconds. He beat some highly specced HSV's with 6L V8's under their bonnets. A great result and some fine driving as seen below, with a great line through Clubhouse Corner.

Colin Strickland in his 911 race car was fourth, despite only completing six laps before he lost a hose and had to retire from the event. Hot on his bumper was John Morrow in his 911 based race car, only a mere two one hundredth's of a second behind Colin. Very close times guys.

Now to the Club Championship results, starting with the various classes. Of course, Barry still leads Renn Klasse 1 and has a healthy lead in the class. Colin Strickland is second, with John Grono in third place. Renn Klasse 2 is still being won by Daniel Bathe, again with a healthy margin starting to appear midway through this shortened season. Phil Green in his 911 GTS, now dubbed the "Green Machine", is second, with Allan Guelfi (997 GT3) sitting in third position. Only two points behind in fourth place is rookie Gerald Ong in his 991 Carrera S. Renn Klasse 3 is still tight, with Peter Ogden (996 Cabriolet) only six points ahead of David Blainey in his 911 '74 RS replica. Gerrit Oplatt is sitting in third place in his 996 Carrera and had a well saved moment at Clubhouse corner - see below.







Renn Klasse 4 is the tightest class at the midway point of the series and sees three drivers on thirty six points - John Wilding ('84 911 Carrera), Bradd Dunne (Cayman) and Seamus Hannigan (Cayman). Caroline Minton (Boxster S) is in fourth place only six points behind. Caroline also leads the Ladies Plate championship. This class is going to go down to the wire and may even have to separated on a count back at this rate. Great to see, and what the Club Sports Series is all about, levelling the playing field and evening out the competition.

Renn Klasse 5 is being run and won by Bill Wright in his '78 911 SC, a.k.a. the "Barbie Car" due to its Rubystone Red paint colour. No stranger to these driving events, Bill stopped the clock in a very respectable 73.61 seconds and beat ten other club members from the two classes above him!

Now, the points you accumulate in your class are then used to determine your position in the Club Championship. So, the top three in the Club Championship after Round 5 are Daniel Bathe, Barry Baltinas and Bill Wright, all on sixty points. Yep - all on equal points. That is levelling the playing field! Levelling it some more, is Peter Ogden on fifty eight points and David Blainey in fifth place with fifty two points. Fantastic stuff and it is going to be a great fight down to the final event.
